# TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 27th JANUARY, 1964.

1.

The Chairman opened the Meeting and thanked all present for their attendance.

The Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting were read and passed.

## RECEIVING THE REPORTS OF THE HONORARY SECRETARY AND HONORARY TREASURER

2.

In the absence of the Honorary Secretary this Report was presented by the Chairman.

Both Reports were adopted.

#### ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE FOR THE ENSUING YEAR

The Chairman regretfully advised the meeting that Mrs. J. Smith did not wish to seek re-election as Honorary Secretary and that this position was therefore vacant. Mr. P.K. Clapham was elected as Honorary Secretary and Mrs. S. Lalley expressed willingness to assist with certain secretarial duties. The meeting expressed its gratitude to Mrs. Smith for her efforts in past years.

The Chairman, Treasurer and Committee resigned, expressed their willingness to be nominated for re-election and were duly elected.

#### DUMPING OF LITTER

The dumping of litter was deplored but it was agreed that there was little beyond general watchfulness which could be done to prevent the problem continuing.

It was agreed that action should be taken to tidy up the 'strip of land'.

#### 5. DAMAGE TO VERGES

The question of damage to verges and the possible erection of posts to prevent this were discussed. The feeling of the meeting was that these posts should be of concrete and it was agreed that an estimate should be obtained and the matter looked into by the Committee.

It was further suggested that a notice should be erected requesting the speed of traffic to be limited to 20 miles per hour.

### 6. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- (a) In connection with the construction work at "Holly Bowers", it was agreed that the Treasurer should approach Messrs. Costain to obtain a contribution for wear to the road surface.
- (b) It was reported that the gate at the Foxbury end was broken and agreed that the desirability of repairing this and strengthening it should be investigated.
- (c) At the request of the meeting the Chairman agreed to make a further approach to the Kent Turf Co., Ltd., on the question of a contribution towards the upkeep of the road.
