

MINUTES of a COMMITTEE MEETING held at the Queens Head
Chislehurst, on Tuesday the 30th May 1967.

The chairman opened the meeting at 8.30p.m.

1. Election of Officers.

The chairman informed the meeting that the Hon. Treasurer was proposing to move away from Kennal Road as a result of his impending retirement, and had decided to withdraw from office at the next Annual General Meeting. The Hon Secretary had also expressed a wish to retire, both from this office and from membership of the Committee, as a result of increased business and other commitments. The members agreed to give the question of nominations consideration before the date of the meeting.

It was also regretted that Mr. Clapham had been forced to resign as a result of ill health.

2. Development at Liskeard Lodge and Foxbury.

This matter had come to a head in the period between the date of distribution of notices calling the meeting, and the present. The chairman reported to the meeting of the excellent response at a meeting held by local residents some days earlier. It was ~~thought~~ thought likely that a large number of residents would be present at the inquiry, at which Mr. A.D.Jackson had been appointed a spokesman for residents.

3. Any other business.

It was agreed that an annual general meeting should be called, and arrangements for this were left to the Hon. Secretary.

The chairman expressed disapproval that Kennal Road was never swept by the Local Authority, and informed the Committee that he had pointed this out to the Council. His application to have the road swept had so far not met with any response. Mr. Laver informed the Committee that he had seen a road sweeper working in the road some three weeks before.

The chairman thanked Mr Laver for his presence on behalf of the new residents at Mapledene and the meeting closed at 9.40.
