

Minutes of a Committee Meeting  
of the Kemnal Road Residents Association  
held at 9 Inglewood on Monday  
25 February 1974 at 8.0 p.m.

Apologies for absence. Miss Allinson-James and  
Mr Greenaway sent their apologies for  
being absent.

Minutes The minutes of the meeting held on  
Tuesday 4 September 1973 were passed  
and signed by the Chairman.

Matters arising. Footpath. The Secretary explained  
that he had had several conversations with  
Mr Farrington and Mrs Farrington, and the latter  
had said that Mr Farrington had now  
decided to make up the pathway. The  
Chairman stated that he had also been contacted  
by another firm, who after  
a few details had been settled would also  
be prepared to make up the pathway. The  
Chairman also pointed out that the cost would  
now exceed the previous figure of £600  
and asked the Committee to agree to this amount  
being increased. This was proposed by Mr  
Maliphant and seconded by Mr Taylor.

Marlone Close As Mr Greenaway was absent it was decided not to discuss the suggestion that Marlone Close should not pay as much as the residents who use more of the road.

Erection of Posts Held in abeyance.

Mulberton Cottage After much discussion it was decided to take no action to oppose the application to modify the Restrictive Covenants affecting the land and premises.

Manhole Cover at Dickens Drive Mr Taylor reported that it had now been repaired.

Annual General Meeting The Secretary was requested to arrange the Annual General Meeting for either the 22 or 29 April 1974. Two hundred and fifty copies of notice would be required for distribution.

Any Other Business Ryeo. The Chairman agreed to arrange for the solicitors to write again to Ryeo. The Chairman drew the Committee's attention to the low standard of repairs carried out by the G.L.C. to the pavement outside of the shops at Royal Parade. He asked the committee to persuade as many people as possible to sign a petition requesting better arrangements.
