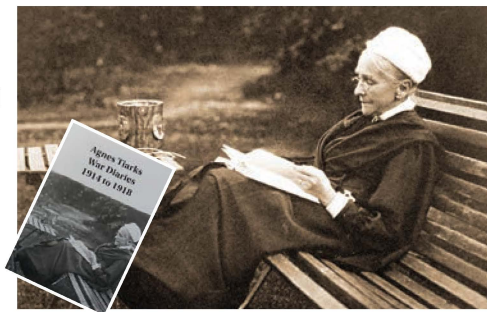

ROAD MATTERS

- Last year, two major sections of the road were resurfaced. This year, the road is standing up well to current volumes of traffic and no major repairs have been necessary. We anticipate that only some local patching will be needed over the next few months.
- Some members may have noticed that the main “private road” sign near the Ashfield Lane junction collapsed and was removed for safety reasons late last year. We are grateful to our member Mr. Sinnott for getting it reinstalled.
 - We would again ask all our members for their co-operation in complying with the **20mph** speed limit as shown on the sign and road markings.
- There are always tasks to do such as cutting back encroaching vegetation and trimming trees. Your Committee members are happy to do this, but extra help at occasional weekend working parties would be greatly appreciated. Please contact the Chairman or Secretary if you can help.

GRASS VERGES

We are intending to replace the broken or missing wooden bollards on the verges at the southern end of the road each side of Marlowe Close. This work will be done over the summer.

SALT/GRIT BINS

Another mild winter, thankfully, so our intrepid road gritters were not called out. However, we can't be complacent. There are grit bins at 4 locations along the road, each of which should have 2 key holders. **We urgently need another keyholder for the grit bin adjacent to Queenborough Gardens** — he or she needs to be willing to help spread grit in a winter emergency. Volunteers please!

AMENITY STRIP

This is the wooded area between The Coach House and Ashfield Lane. The Amenity Strip is administered by 4 Trustees, who are also Committee members of the Association. The Trustees have no funds, and last year members at the AGM agreed to contribute up to £1,000 per year to allow the Trustees to carry out essential safety works to lop overhanging branches, fell rotten trees and control vegetation affecting the road; and also to fund any further safety work which might be needed in future years. Extensive work was carried out to the Amenity Strip in April and we hope everyone agrees that the Strip now looks much tidier. Replacement saplings will be planted in the more exposed areas to compensate for the diseased elm trees.

MEMORIAL BENCH

Members will have noticed the memorial bench to Mr. P.K Chow which has been installed outside Willett House. Mr. Chow was a well-known figure in Kemnal Road, having lived for several years in Copperfield Way until his death last year. The Committee is very grateful to Mr. Chow's son for contributing the funds for the installation of this seat and its plinth in memory of his father.



THE WIDER AREA

At last year's AGM, we mentioned possible proposals being developed by LB Bromley to reconfigure the roads around the Common in order to reduce the number of accidents. We will be monitoring the development of these proposals and whether they affect the difficulties which drivers and pedestrians face in exiting from Kemnal Road into Ashfield Lane because of the volume and speed of traffic. The Association has been added to the Council's list of consultees and we will keep everybody informed of developments via the Kemnal Road website. We will also continue to press for parking controls on the southern common end of Kemnal Road.

We sometimes get complaints about noise caused by neighbours or other occupants of properties in the road. The Association is not in a position to intervene in such disputes, but Bromley Council's out of hours noise service (tel. 0300 303 8671) should be able to help.

YOUR COMMITTEE

We are always happy to welcome new members of the Committee. Last year, we were joined by Vinod Khanna who kindly volunteered to take on the role of Secretary. Welcome Vinod.

At last year's AGM, members decided to increase the subscription in 2014/15 by £5 per household to £35, and asked the Committee to keep the financial situation

...under close review so that prompt action could be taken to raise the subscription again if it became necessary. We have reviewed the financial position during the year and in view of the present good state of the road and the current financial balances which are sufficient to allow about 1.5 stretches of road to be resurfaced if needed, **we recommend that the annual subscription should be unchanged at £35 for 2015/16** but that it should be increased to £40 per household from 2016/17 when we calculate that further resurfacing could be needed.
